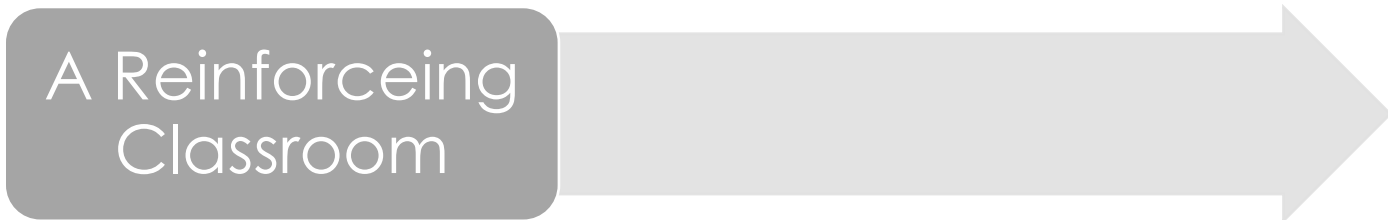
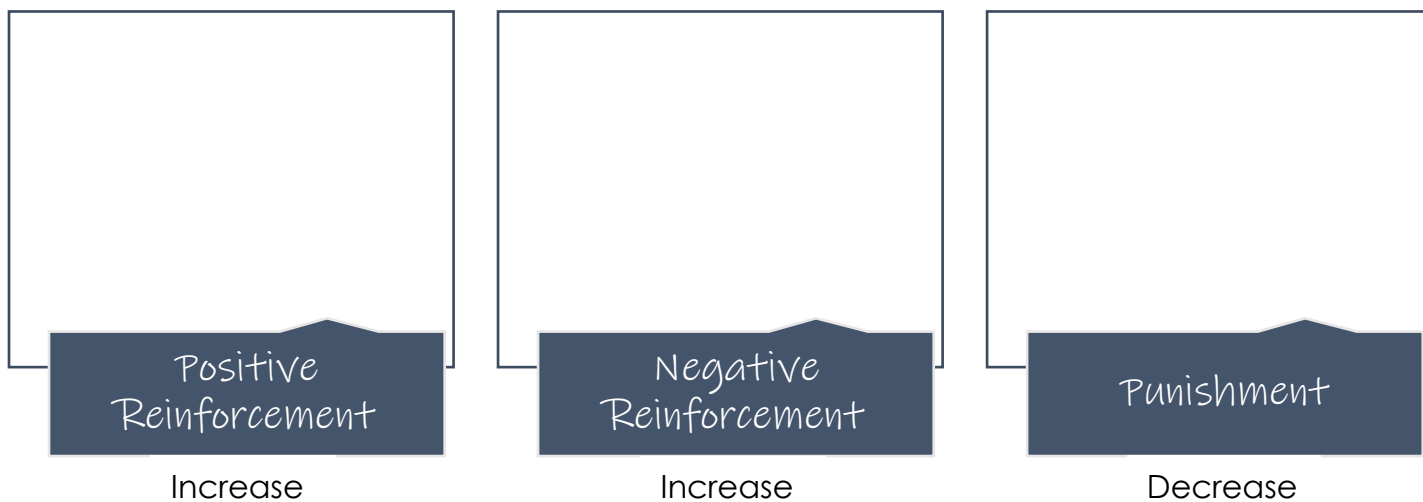


Top Ten Mistakes in Behavior Management: A Rationale for Positive Reinforcement
